Dr Jacqueline Savard is a Lecturer in Health Ethics and Professionalism at Deakin School of Medicine. Her previous role was postdoctoral researcher at the Centre for Values, Ethics and the Law in Medicine (VELiM) at the University of Sydney, where she worked on the <<https://www.genioz.net.au/>> Genioz study. She is originally from Canada and completed her Bachelor of Science at the University of Alberta. Jacqueline completed her Master of Bioethics (Honours) at the University of Sydney in 2009 where her Honours thesis focused on genetic testing for ethnic ancestry. In 2016, Jacqueline completed her PhD in bioethics. Her thesis was the first empirical research in Australia to explore Australian consumers' knowledge, attitudes and experiences of direct-to-consumer personal genome testing. Her current research interests include ethical, legal and social issues of genetics and genomics (in the clinical and commercial context), Indigenous health ethics and the ethics of personalised medicine.
